Revd Shelagh Jones, our 'Spiritual Animator', writes:

I told those of you who were at the AGM about my discoveries of a very thriving Cursillo movement in Tenerife, so I thought that, as I'm writing this from France, I'd do a little research into Cursillo in France. To my surprise, I see that the very first French Cursillo weekend took place in Perpignan (our local diocese) in 1961, gifted by the diocese of Girona in Spain. Unfortunately, for whatever reason, there was no follow-up and there's certainly no sign of Cursillo in Perpignan diocese today.

It was 30 years before Cursillo resurfaced in France - within the Vietnamese community in Paris! There are now some 2000 Vietnamese Cursillistas in Paris and they've gifted Cursillo to the Vietnamese community in Stuttgart in Germany.

In 2001 Cursillistas from Spain ran a first weekend for the Spanish community in Paris. The movement took root and holds 2 weekends a year. Two years later, in conjunction with the Paris Vietnamese movement, the Paris Spanish movement organised a weekend in Paris in French. This second gifting of Cursillo to the French Catholic Church was from a French-speaking diocese in Canada.

That first French weekend took place in a monastery in Montmartre (an area of Paris more famous for its nightclubs!!) with 14 staff and 11 pilgrims. The Lay Rector and Spiritual Advisers came from Canada and the rest of the staff from Spain, Portugal, Luxembourg and the Paris Vietnamese Cursillo movement.

Strangely, Cursillo in France has never managed to spread far beyond the diocese of Paris. Only the neighbouring dioceses of Evry and Versailles have taken it up.

French Cursillo is much younger than British Anglican Cursillo and, while very enthusiastic, is spreading only slowly. Let us remember them in our prayers.

One thing that caught my eye: in French, the Spiritual Director is the "animateur spiritual". Spiritual animator? Now that I like!
