Our Lay Director, Jan Watts, writes. Dear friends,

As you are reading this we are nearing York 27. Our thoughts and prayers are with Rosemary Gillespie as she prepares to lead the weekend, with her team who are a wonderfully diverse group and especially with our Pilgrims who we hope will truly encounter God on their weekend. Cursillo closing services are wonderfully uplifting experiences. It is great for the pilgrims to realise that they are part of a much bigger family then simply those they have met on the week-end. So do try to come to the closing service at Wydale at 3pm on Sunday 3rd. June. It will be light as you drive home again and I guarantee you will feel uplifted and blessed.



On April 7th we met at St. Mary's Scarborough for our AGM, followed by an Ultreya and a wonderful Eucharist to give thanks for the last year of Cursillo in the York Diocese and pray for God's hand on us in the coming year.

York Cursillo is run by a Secretariat (or committee) on which people serve for no more than 3 years, 4 if there are exceptional circumstances. The constant turnover brings a freshness of vision to our discussions but it is dependent on Cursillistas, old or new, offering themselves to stand. Meetings are generally lively and always involve cake!. They begin with a message from Jonathan and a short Group Reunion so that we are in the right place to hear and receive God's plans for us.

Currently we are searching for three people to join the Secretariat.

Firstly we need **a pre-Cursillo rep** who deals with sponsorship and pilgrims before they go on their week-end. The rep prepares application forms for each new week-end. S/he receives applications and responds to both the sponsor and the pilgrim. She gives further details to the pilgrims nearer the time. So s/he is the first point of contact with the pilgrims and can also answer any queries they may have. S/he also books our week-ends at Wydale well in advance under the direction of the Secretariat. So you can see that it is not a particularly onorous job.

Secondly we need **a resources rep**. As you must be aware there are many resources needed for the week-end, from service sheets to comfort basket, from art materials to hymn books. Currently these are all stored at St. Mark's church Scarborough but they could easily be moved to a church hall or garage in any part of the Diocese. After the week-end they are usually in a bit of a mess but the Lay Director and Week-end Co-ordinator are happy to help sort them and between those three, new resources need to be ordered or photocopied. Do you have a church with a bit of spare storage or a spare bedroom or shelf or two in a dry garage? We should be so pleased to hear from you.



Finally we want to create a new Secretariat position to promote Cursillo within the Diocese. This would be largely up to the person appointed. Do you have Deanery or Diocesan contacts you can talk to? Are you good at creating posters or flyers we can give out? Can you get our name into church magazines or start a Twitter account or get more people using our Facebook account? This is not my strength but I'm sure someone out there must have the energy and enthusiasm to really put Cursillo on the map in the York Diocese. It astounds me that we still have people who say — Cursillo — never heard of it.

A letter from our SD, Jonathan Couper

Dear All,

When Pentecost dawned a month after Jesus' death and resurrection, one hundred and twenty disciples of Jesus had already spent much time together in prayer and worship.

Making space to allow God to come close in a safe place can be life transforming, and we have found that Cursillo weekends can bring that transformation to everyone involved.

Weekends are not the end of the story – just the beginning- for we are still called to develop our faith more and more. But for you who have attended Cursillo weekends, you have rich treasured memories of what God did then and has continued to do since. You have also found through Ultreyas and group reunions a community of those who engage with God. This year we are introducing a further way—a quiet day on September 20th. There are more details in this newsletter. We hope others will also



come to join us in the life we know in Cursillo and the day of deeper understanding and taster ultreays are a good way to find out more by personal experience.

Jesus once said, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst" (Matthew 18:20) God abides with us relationally – in the relationships between the two or the three. We are knit together to form a temple in which he dwells by His Spirit. The more "at one" in mind and heart we become the deeper He dwells. Let us not neglect to meet together but rather let us encourage one another" (Hebrews 10:25).

What about encouraging someone who is not yet a Cursillo member to attend the next Cursillo weekend? Why not come with a friend to the Day of Deeper Understanding – a day you may never have experienced before. Who knows where this might lead!

In the words of Paul 2 Corinthians 13:11 "Finally, brothers and sisters, rejoice! (same word Philippians 4:1 etc) Come together (same verb used in Mark 1:19 for mending nets), encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you." Great advice for us. The God of love and peace is with us more so when we rejoice, come together, encourage one another, are of one mind and live in peace. May the Lord richly fill our meetings together more and more — in Ultreyas to Days of Deeper Understanding, in Cursillo weekends to Group Reunions, in Secretariats to National events

Just a thought.....

to aid our walk in the fullness of life when life gets tough

Emptiness in the soul is a terrible pain. It can be experienced when hopes are dashed; when life takes a turn for the worst or when we see the horror of some wrong we or others have done. When this happens, like Ruth's mother in law, Naomi of old, we who used to be full, can become empty (Ruth 1:21). Emptiness affects our well being, making us sad and unable to avoid weariness or depression in life. Jesus came that we should be full of life, and on this Easter season, I want to give some pointers so we walk in the fullness of life Jesus promised

Fullness in the soul does not come about by being good. It comes by receiving goodness. Our mindset can push goodness away – we can be too busy, defensive, or guilty. Be kind to yourself. Jesus is! (see Psalm 136; 103:17; Jeremiah 31:3). Don't condemn yourself. Jesus doesn't (see John 8:11; Luke 6:36; Ephesians 2:4). Good friends, Good landscapes, Good food all help, but a good rhythm in life is best.

Fullness in the soul needs hope. Hope is something beyond what you can do. To have hope involves turning our eyes upon Jesus, and putting our lives in the context of a rich eternity. It is the start of learning to live from the future hope rather than out of the past events or the present circumstances.. You are so much more important and significant than the environment you live in or the deeds you do. Your identity should not be confined to your present or past . You partner God as you journey to heaven.

Fullness of life in the soul and wounds in the soul cannot live together. Jesus died not only so we could be forgiven but so he could carry our griefs. Just as we can choose not to confess our sin, so we can choose to carry our griefs. Living in the fullness of the soul means we have to frequently dump our griefs on Him trusting God with the consequences so we can walk free of them.

Fullness in the soul needs nourishment. Feed your souls in group reunions, personal bible study. Attend quiet days and do things which nourish you. We all have tasks which we find draining. Try to look beyond them to things which will nourish you. Do everything with prayer in your heart and thanksgiving.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR CURSILLO AGM REPORT

The last year has been for me a year of introductions and good memories. I have attended the national AGM in Durham, the Cursillo leaders workshop in Staffordshire, two excellent weekends at Wydale under lay rectors Mary Hart and Tracy Bowers as well as a national Ultreya at Southall and countless number of Ultreyas plus my group reunion group in Bridlington.... throughout each I have valued the openness to the Lord and a deep devotion to him which resounds from the lives of those who were there. I have heard testimony of the life within Cursillo and seen how it blesses the local church; I have witnessed the wonder of weekends to transform and the encouragement of long standing members to those who are new, as well as those who are new encouraging the established members.

it has been great to see the increased attendance at our Ultreyas. Part of this may be because this year we introduced taster days and this seems to have encouraged Cursillistas to invite their friends to taste and experience Cursillo at Ultreyas. I have also been encouraged by the fact that most new pilgrims are attending Ultreyas as soon as they can. The more we have at these meetings the better.

In the diocese we can because of our lack of numbers be easily ignored as irrelevant. My own belief is that Cursillo is highly relevant. It is a movement of renewal which touches the heart. It operates relationally and has something unique to offer in the local church,

and what it brings is across different spiritualities.

Cursillo is a lay movement (and we are grateful for Jan Watts for her leadership as lay director). The fact we are a lay movement means we are ideally placed to support lay ministry in the local parishes. Many churches especially towards the east of the diocese would not be the same without some of its key members belonging to Cursillo with the

encouragement it can bring.

We're now pressing forward to expand our numbers. Much to the approval of the bishop of Hull we are seeking to make Cursillo open to everyone regardless as to whether they can afford it or not. This is a step of faith. We want to invite to a weekend everyone who God is calling. Our hope is that members support us financially so we can continue to do this. The more who come to weekends should increase the membership of Cursillo and as it does so, we will have finance to support others to join us. We want everyone to benefit from the ongoing life Cursillo can bring.

Cursillo grows relationally, so we are dependant for our growth on those who have been on

weekends inviting their friends.

- We would love also to grow quickly in parts of the diocese where Cursillo is weak, but because we operate relationally, it is likely that growth will be in the churches from where we come. If you move churches try to stay in your reunion group if you still live near enough to continue to go so your relationships remain to nourish you and others. If you are moving to a place where there is no Cursillo, let us discuss how best Cursillo can be introduced there.
- .Every plant grows. Expansion needs strength in the centre. As well as expanding our ongoing spiritual life needs to be strong. for many the deep religious experience at a weekend has been encouraged to develop not only by Ultreyas but also by joining the team for a weekend. This year we want to also introduce quiet days where we have meditations and communion interspersed with craft or prayer activities as people choose. Our first one is in September this year.

Finally I want to thank all Cursillistas for your contribution to the life we experience as Cursillo in the York Diocese. I have mentioned already the lay rectors of the Cursillo weekends Mary Hart and Tracy Bowers who with their teams did such good work on this year's weekends. I wish to also thank the secretariat for their work — especially Margaret Price who is stepping down this year. As a movement we look forward together to all the Lord wants to do this next year
